

Responsibilities

Advocacy and Research (75%)

- In collaboration with the Early Warning System Working Group and partners in Latin American and the Caribbean, strategize, build and sustain relationships with social movements, civil society organizations and community organizers to support community-led development priorities in the region.
- Produce and share accessible summaries and translations of verified information on investments proposed and approved in the region and identify potential human and environmental risks and abuses.
- Following community priorities, support the creation and implementation of national, regional and international campaign strategies towards governments, companies and investors operating in the region.
- Following community priorities, coordinate in-person research and strategy trainings, <u>using IAP training materials</u>, to complement community-led advocacy towards governments, companies and investors.
- While centering community priorities, priorities and voices, write and contribute to reports and articles on human and environmental rights to advance community-led campaigns and the policy and practice change of development actors.

- Become an active member of two internal IAP programmatic Working Groups.
- As part of the broader movement for development justice, serves as a coordinator in two allied networks, for example on climate justice or the protection of rights defenders.
- Manage interns and volunteers and provide regular guidance to IAP colleagues to realize their individual work plans.
- Provide updates for monthly programmatic reports, and annual donor reports and perform a range of operational work, including liaising with contractors and interpreters, managing budgets and finances, and other tasks, as needed.
- Support IAP fundraising and donor relationships by contributing to donor meetings and related proposals and reports.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will thrive in a multicultural workspace, be organized, be able to multitask, meet agreed deadlines, and will have:

- Significant human and environmental rights experience and at least 5 years of work history.
- Experienced community mobilizer for human and environmental rights campaigns.
- Skilled facilitator and trainer with community organizers, local groups, and social movements in Latin America and the Caribbean as well as a range of civil society organizations operating at the local, national, regional, and international levels.
- Experience in and understanding of Indigenous Peoples and traditional people's rights, Climate Justice, and Gender Justice is highly preferred.
- Ability to coordinate and actively engage in advocacy meetings with representatives of government, companies, and investors.
- Experience managing interns and providing work plan guidance to colleagues.
- An undergraduate degree is preferred, and a graduate degree is an advantage. Exceptional candidates with comparable backgrounds will be considered.



Qualifications

- Advanced writing, speaking, and listening levels of English are required.
- Advanced writing, speaking, and listening levels in Spanish are highly preferred.
- Advanced writing, speaking, and listening levels in Portuguese are highly preferred.
- Competency in multiple research approaches and analyses.
- Experience with data management or a willingness to learn.
- Strong interpersonal skills, with the ability to build and sustain relationships with a diverse set of partners and colleagues.
- Humility, intellectual curiosity, and humor.
- Self-starter with strong organizational and time-management skills.
- Ability to work independently and resourcefully, and in close coordination with a global remote team.
- Ability to attend meetings to accommodate different time zones.
- Potential travel locally, regionally, and internationally, as needed.



Compensation
