## Campaign Communications Internship

**Organization:** The [International Accountability Project](#) (IAP) is an international human and environmental rights organization that works with communities, civil society and social movements to change how today's development is done.

IAP is part of a global movement, rooted in the aspirations of people for justice and to thrive today and tomorrow. Efforts to shift today's development from its current focus on political and business interests to community-led priorities is a response to the unwanted and harmful projects that uproot people, end livelihoods and erase culture. It is a response to a power imbalance that, if redirected to community-led priorities, would improve lives and protect the environment.

IAP works in solidarity with communities, civil society and social movements to inform and amplify their campaigns, broaden access to information, and create spaces within and outside dominant power systems for communities to lead the development decisions that affect their lives and environment.

**Description:** The IAP Campaign Communications Internship is designed for a dedicated activist with excellent communication and project management skills. The intern will engage with communities, partners, and staff to help shape and contribute to communications across IAP's core strategies. This is a part-time position (24 hours per week) with a three-month commitment. We prefer candidates based in the Asia-Pacific region. A monthly stipend of USD 400 is provided.

Based on skillsets, interest and the IAP Communications Calendar, the *Campaign Communications Internship* can include the following tasks:

### Core Responsibilities

- Support the communications team in implementing the global communications strategy and maintaining the editorial calendar
- Coordinate the distribution of blog posts, public statements, and articles across digital channels in collaboration with program staff
- Provide communications support for webinars and training sessions
- Support joint communication campaigns with partners and monitor partner-led initiatives to ensure alignment
- Coordinate translation, proofreading, and formatting of training materials by liaising with consultants, including creative professionals for visual or audiovisual content when needed

- Assist in drafting and documenting stories for IAP newsletters and external publications, with a focus on human-centered narratives.

### **Additional Responsibilities (as needed)**

- Conduct regular media monitoring to identify opportunities for IAP's work to be featured in external outlets
- Assist in tracking and analyzing performance metrics across digital platforms, including social media, the website, and newsletters
- Support the delivery of training sessions and help develop internal guidance on social media best practices for IAP staff.

**Qualifications:** The successful candidate has a personal and professional commitment to human and environmental rights with at least 1 year of experience. They should have a proven track record of creating accessible communications for activist purposes. This role requires strong coordination skills to support the communications team and assist in leading IAP's organizational communications.

- An undergraduate degree is required, and a graduate degree (in progress or completed) is preferred. Comparable work and life experiences will be considered
- Knowledge of international human rights principles
- Experience writing and editing articles and blog posts in English
- Fluency in English and additional language skills are strongly preferred
- Project management skills with people across cultures, languages, and time zones
- Proven ability to translate complex policy jargon into accessible content and the skill to turn personal narratives into compelling calls for action
- Knowledge of MS Office, Google applications, Canva, and WordPress
- Ability to work resourcefully and multitask effectively
- Sense of humor and flexibility
- Preferred: Hold a degree in Communication and Media Studies/Journalism/English Language and Literature/Creative Writing/Development Studies
- Preferred: Previous experience volunteering or working within NGO sector.
